There are some changes on the horizon...

But before we must look back over the 2022/2023 Jumps season as it was not an easy one to digest...

The British weather is perhaps the most talked about subject in most households and Thorndale was no different to others when we recall the incredibly dry Autumn and early Spring and in between there was a bit of everything from snow to rain.

Our season here was very similar as we had a good autumn right up to Christmas and then we had a very quiet period when nothing seemed to go right but in the spring it all changed and the horses ran out of their skins.

We certainly had some great moments...

Gerard Mentor started our season off with an unexpected win at Market Rasen. Probably helped by the fact that the saddle slipped and he got such a shock that he took off under Kevin Brogan. Kevin was the 2021/2022 season conditional jockey find.

Shantou Express proved that he could stay 3 and ¼ miles around Stratford carrying 12 stone. A fine feat although I am not sure he really stayed, but it was a good result. We had loads of seconds in June and that was broken by **Halligator** winning at Uttoxeter. I have never seen a horse carry his head so low. Our only winner in July was Julie and David Martin's and Dan Hall's **Ajero** winning at Glorious Goodwood which was a huge result and one that

showed his second at Royal Ascot was no fluke. Jumping for **Ajero** has become a distant memory.

We hardly had a runner until October when **Gerard Mentor** won his second race over hurdles at Warwick... He arrived in front with a fine waiting ride for new stable conditional Kai Lenihan. **Gerard Mentor** went on to win two more races with his new jockey friend Kai. I have to say that winning four in a season with GM was not something we really would have expected but learning how to ride him certainly helped...I think we had a saddle slip and Kevin Brogan to thank for that!

Norman Carter's consistent **Samatian** won at Stratford and was placed in his next five runs. Don't you just love the handicapper!! It was then John Perriss's homebred mare **I Spy a Diva** who won next at Ludlow. This tough little lady went on to win three on the bounce and fill John's pockets with a few welcome GBB prizes. She finished her season with a cracking run at Cheltenham in April when finishing a good third in the listed mare's novice hurdle, but then the handicapper penalised her 5lbs for the effort!

Ffos Las has been a lucky racecourse for us over the years and the KBRs **Shinobi** kept the ball rolling there and two days later last season's

bumper winner **Chianti Classico**, owned by Francis Brooke and Richard Pilkington slightly surprised us with a huge win at Chepstow in what looked a very competitive novice hurdle on his first start over hurdles. On the same day John Perriss' **Getaweapon** won at Bangor. Three days later and a rare visit to Fontwell saw Michael and Mary Dulverton's **Sayadam** to win by a nose.

Back at Ffos Las in November **Phantom Getaway** proved to be very well handicapped when winning under Ciaran Gethings in the mud. Yes...the mud!

Does He Know who had such a good season in 2021/2022 took his form to a new level when carrying 12 stone over 3 and half miles at Cheltenham. What an extraordinary horse he is, quirky but very tough. DHK went on the be placed in The Denman Chase at Newbury and then a niggler stopped his season.

Phil and Gill Andrews's **Party Fuzz** skipped round Hereford beating a well touted Gordon Elliot horse, but in all these cases the handicapper had his say and made the rest of his season difficult until he relented, and then he so nearly won his last race of the season at Chepstow...yes...second!

It was back to Ffos Las and very soft ground. Probably the only racecourse to offer those conditions? The Turf Club's **Broomfield Present** and The Real Partnerships homebred **Trelawne** had been waiting and waiting for that ground, and both relished the opportunity to show off their ability and both won well...shortly after **Chianti Classico** followed up his Chepstow win at Market Rasen.

Moonlighter owned by Huw & Richard Davies and Friends (many) also added another winner to the board. A couple of days later **Heros De Romay** just about made all in the bumper at Exeter. John Perriss's **Top Target** won on his first hurdle start at Wetherby.

We had been struggling with John Perriss's **Rockys Treasure** and then a golden opportunity arrived in a Conditional Jockey Veterans chase at Doncaster, Kai and Rocky did not let us down. What a great win to retire him on. Shortly after that John Perriss, who had such a great early season with his horses, saw his **Bobhopeornhope** win the Tanners Claret Chase at Ludlow. Both John and I enjoy the sponsors products and an ideal way to end 2022. Well not quite as Jem Cross's **Saint Bibiana** did that for us in the last race of the year, the bumper, at Uttoxeter.

2023 and January started with **Chianti Classico** winning at Wincanton on rain softened ground which was not ideal for him.

We then had a torrid time for about 5 weeks until it suddenly all came together for no apparent reason when **Trelawne** spread eagled a competitive field at Uttoxeter on his preferred soft ground. Then five days later it was double time at Haydock with Peter & Fiona Woodhalls and Mark & Melinda Laws **Equus Dreamer** and The Turf Clubs **Broomfield Present**, who both put up impressive displays.

We hardly had a runner for a month due to the drying ground and then the weather relented. Kim Bailey Racing Syndicate horses **El Rio** and **Two for Gold** won at my favourite racecourse Ascot. They were two

impressive performances, sadly I watched both from my hospital bed!

Picks Lad won at Taunton. Well, did he? he was second and moved up to first, thankfully the appeal was turned over and **Picks Lad** kept his race...deservedly so!

Our last winner of the season was the hugely impressive **The Kemble Brewery**. This KBR owned horse, who also runs for the charity Winston Wish certainly took the eye and went into many a notebook for this coming winter.

Our last runner of the season was Tony Solomon's **First Flow**. The ultra tough **First Flow** so enjoyed his run at Sandown, when second to Hewick, that we all decided to keep him going for another season. What a trooper he has been to the yard over the years - he just loves his racing!

All in all, it was not an easy season, although we finished with the same number of winners (34) as the previous season. Too many seconds meant that we really felt we should have had more winners!

During the summer months we have resurfaced our round gallop with new sand plus everything in the yard has been steam cleaned and disinfected. Concrete in the yard has been repaired too.

There have been a few changes over the summer, the most notable one is that Charly Bond has joined us as Head Girl. Leigh Pollard continues as Travelling head person while David Bass and Ciaran Gething continue to ride most of the horses along with Kai

Lenihan, who remains our conditional jockey, and Lauren Keen-Hawkins who holds her amateur license. Sandie Wilkinson remains to be the power behind the office throne when it comes to accounts. Maya Quist took over the role as my PA and day to day office work. Peter Kerr continues to do sterling work organising our Kim Bailey Racing Syndicates (KBRS). Then it comes to a very long-suffering wife...Clare has had a torrid year with me. Thankfully those horrid corners have been turned, but without her strength and patience where would I be.

Moving on, as you know Mat is very much part of Kim Bailey Racing Ltd. Mat has been here at Thorndale for the best part of 15 years and his help has been so valuable, and on that note, it is only fair that I can announce that he will be joining me on my licence over the coming months. I have one more milestone to pass and then it will be all change.

Looking ahead for the coming months it is going to be very exciting as we have some special horses to run. We should have more chase runners this season as many of the youngster that have come through from the Irish and English point to point world are now ready to move over to the larger obstacles.

So, to my loyal and happy band of owners. Thanks for the support and let's have some serious fun and success this winter!


