

Our 2023/2024 season was an interesting one. The weather was certainly trying for all. Many meetings off and waterlogged. Global warming...

We started last season with a winner for John Perriss with his good mare I Spy A Diva at Warwick. Gosh, that feels a long time ago! Destroytheevidence won at Worcester in May and went on to win two other races at Kempton and was placed in a couple of good races at Cheltenham and Doncaster. In fact, it was to be a good season for Phil and Gill Andrews who certainly endured a shocker the season before. This time it came good for The Edgar Wallace who won two and probably should have at least won another. Their Mr Grey Sky won two also. Phil is involved in The Kemble Brewery Breakfast at 10 syndicate who after winning a couple of bumpers sadly struck into himself on his hurdling debut at Cheltenham and missed the rest of the season. He is ok and as they say fate/time!

Elizabeth Kellar could not contain her excitement when watching her homebred mare Faerie Cutlass win at Worcester. The smile on her face shows why having a homebred winner is just such a thrill. John and Laura Garrett's French bred horse Jeudidee won a bumper at Warwick and then went on to win two hurdle races at Worcester and Exeter. Shantou Express carried top weight at Stratford, a race he had won before. SE wins every season - a great syndicate horse to be involved in!

Richard and Susan Davies moved Lady Gwen here and she won first time out at Stratford and then went on to win a couple more. She ran about 8 times in 8 weeks and was never unplaced. Mikhailovich won easily at Huntingdon and was third on his next run at Market Rasen. He loves quick ground, so this winter was not for him.

Chepstow in the pouring rain and it was horizontal to say the least. Cornelius Lysaght joined Richard Pilkington in the paddock to watch Chianti Classico make a hugely impressive winning start to his chasing career. Jumping like a buck he sailed through the mud like a knife through butter! Chianti Classico went on to have the most brilliant season, winning at Ascot for his owners Francis Brooke and

Richard Pilkington. It was Francis's first winner at his racecourse, when I say his racecourse, I mean that Francis is His Majesty's Representative at Ascot. It was a very special, but nerve-racking day as the ground was far too fast for CC who never looked happy on it, but guts took him through to win. CC went on to finish second at Kempton and then as we all know he gave us that important win at The Cheltenham Festival. A day none of us will ever forget. Including watching David Bass entering the winner's enclosure like a Roman General entering conquering Rome. Trelawne was also in the same race at Cheltenham but sadly he fell at the second fence. I just love Trelawne, perhaps like me he has no pedigree, although Trelawne is not an Essex boy, but at least he is seriously talented. Sandra Steer-Fowler's home bred started off with an impressive win at Carlisle and then was placed in good company at Cheltenham and Wetherby, frankly he was unlucky not to win both. Thankfully he was OK after his fall and after summer out he will return stronger and hopefully a wiser and better horse.

Percy Veering the horse that finally came good and won three chases. Time and patience can be very rewarding and for his happy band of loyal supporters he did them proud.

Heros de Romay was given a fine ride by Gavin Sheehan to win at Chepstow and Heros went on to be placed on both his next runs. He has schooled over fences and that will be his forte this coming season. Talking great rides Gavin Sheehan gave Parc d'Amour an outstanding one to win at Huntingdon.. He missed the break and got left behind.. did not panic and got up on the line!

One of the results of the season and probably the most exciting was watching Ciaran Gethings somehow lift victory out of the jaws of defeat on General Hubble in the dark at Market Rasen. Mat said that it was his moment of the season. It was a huge win for his happy team of owners who celebrated that win in some style.

I should have announced his retirement there and then but there would not have been a big enough bucket and with Matt Chapman breathing down my neck... I was not man enough to cope! The good news is that FF has a wonderful life ahead of him in retirement as he is in Ireland with Kayleigh Thompson who looked after Solomons other great horse Harry Topper. Does He Know showed us his zest for the game is still there when putting up an incredible weight carrying performance to win the Grimthorpe Chase off a mark of 149 under David Bass.

Towards the end of the season things began to quieten down due to the handicapper catching up with many of our horses and as we all know it is a numbers game and we have been short in that department, but Magical Escape won well at Chepstow and showed what he is capable of and Halligator did the same when winning under top weight at Huntingdon to end our season.

We finished 27th in the trainers list with £498,249.00 in prize money..32 winners..22 seconds and 26 thirds from the 57 horses we ran.

A big thank you to all my owners, David Bass and Ciaran Gethings who rode most of our horses and Peter Kerr for tirelessly organising our in-house KBR syndicates... That was the 2023/2024 season.



All options remain open this year - he will most likely start at Ascot in November and we would love to think we could end up back at Aintree in April with a live chance in the Grand National.




